The session deals with issues like immigration regulations, registering for classes at ASU and student advising.

Marlay said the orientation is mandatory for all international students new to the university.

The office also holds a monthly program for the students dealing with a variety of topics.

"We have done programs on travel, weather preparedness, scholarships and American football. The topic varies," Marlay said.

Other services the office offers are a program each semester to assist students with cultural adjustment, aid in filing income tax returns and a workshop on how to prepare for job interviews for students who are nearing graduation.

Many international students have had good experiences at ASU.

"Everyone here is friendly," Aida Ali, a sophomore journalism major of Tanzania, said.

"People are very nice here. They are friendly and willing to help," Dilok Phanchantraurai, a graduate student in education of Thailand, said. Phanchantraurai has been at ASU for five years.

"Before I came here, I thought the U.S. was a little bit dangerous and that people were selfish and did not

like international students. I thought people may be scared of me," Hyo-Jin Lee, a senior Center for English as a Second Language student of South Korea, said.

Lee said through involvement in her local church and getting to know American students, she has learned differently.

"People are kind here. If I ask a favor, they say OK. I have made real good friends," Lee, who has been here for five months, said.

Another service available to international students is the International Student Association.

"ISA is a social event for both international and American students. We have events that enhance people's views on other cultures," Mahfam Moeeni, president of ISA, said.

According to Moeeni, a freshman pre-optometry major of Jonesboro, ISA sponsors events such as International Week. During this week, the ISA hosts activities such as an international food festival and cultural night. ISA also hosts dances, an annual Thanksgiving dinner and trips to Memphis, Tenn., for various reasons.

"I would like encourage more American students to join our club. It is an experience for both American and international students," Moeeni said.
